Dr. Linda Bradley is a Senior Lecturer in higher education pedagogy at the Department of education, communication and learning, working at the Pedagogical Development and Interactive Learning unit (PIL). Her research concerns social interaction and the use of digital technology in learning and education.

Currently, her research focuses on digital and mobile learning in formal and informal settings with newly arrived migrants. One project concerns vocational learning with Swedish as a Foreign Language and one is a crosscultural vocational learning project within teacher training, investigating women refugees' trajectories in a new society in a collaboration with Lebanese American University in Beirut. Linda was project leader for Minclusion (minclusion.org), Integration med mobilen, a research and development project of mobile learning applications for newly arrived Arabic speaking migrants to Sweden with a focus on pedagogical approaches in digital technology for learning Swedish and about Swedish culture. Another interest is open learning and education where she has investigated open learning practices through her work in EU projects with the aim of developing pedagogical and methodological approaches to using digital tools for teaching and learning.

Linda's background is within language learning and information technology. She has a long experience in technical communication and Language for Specific Purposes (LSP) for engineering students as well as Master Mariner students working at Chalmers University of Technology. In her research at Chalmers, she engaged specifically in student collaboration and peer response in face-to-face as well as digital environments.

At PIL she is teaching courses in pedagogy for teaching staff from all faculties at University of Gothenburg. Linda is also vice-president of the non-profit association Research-publishing.net.



Dr. Christine C. M. Goh is Professor of Education (Linguistics and Language Education) and Dean for Graduate Studies and Professional Learning at the National Institute of Education, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore. She completed her PhD in Linguistics at Lancaster University, UK. Her MA in Applied English Linguistics degree was obtained at the University of Birmingham with the support of the UK government's Chevening Scholarship. As the NIE Dean of Graduate Studies and Professional Learning and previously as Associate Dean for Higher Degrees, Christine has been actively involved in the past nine years in leading NIE's strategic initiatives for teacher continuing education through in-service courses and graduate programmes. She is a member of the NTU Advisory Board and was previously a University Senator. She is the co-editor of two international education journals by Routledge: Asia Pacific Journal of Education and Pedagogies.

A qualified English teacher turned teacher educator and researcher, Christine is known internationally in the field of applied linguistics, particularly for her work in metacognition and bilingual/ second language oracy (listening, speaking and thinking). She publishes extensively and contributes to theory building as well as academic and professional discourse in English language teaching and assessment. Christine's work is widely cited and she is frequently invited to speak at international conferences and forums. Since joining NIE/NTU, Christine has taught on and managed various undergraduate, pre-service, in-service and higher degree courses in the English Language & Literature Academic Group and she has supervised to completion over 30 students in Masters and PhD research. She received two NIE teaching commendation awards and was conferred the Public Administration Medal (Bronze) in 2014.



Dr. Yilin Sun is tenured professor at Seattle Colleges, USA. She received her Ph.D. in Applied Linguistics/Curriculum & Instruction from the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education (OISE)/University of Toronto, Canada. Currently she directs Faculty Development programs at the Seattle Colleges. Yilin served as President of TESOL International Association (2014-2015), founding President of Macau Association of Applied Linguistics (MAAL) and Chair of 2018 Asia-TEFL International Conference. She also served as President of Washington Association for the Education of Speakers of Other Languages (WAESOL) in 2003 and 2007.



Department of State and has conducted teacher training workshops in many countries including Bolivia, Cambodia, China, South Korea, Laos, Russia, and Thailand.

She is the author and co-author of books, book chapters, and research papers in refereed professional journals. She also serves as Chief Editor for the new series, *Foreign Language Teacher Education and Development-Selected Works of Renowned TESOL Experts* published by Shanghai Academic Publishing Center for Foreign Language Education, Shanghai Foreign Language Education Press. Over the years, Dr. Sun has also frequently been invited to give keynote, plenary and featured speeches at national and international conferences. She is excited to come back to Taiwan for this international conference.



Dr. Dennis Tay is Associate Professor in the Department of English, and Associate Dean of the Faculty of Humanities at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University. He has a PhD in linguistics and postgraduate qualifications in statistics and quantitative analysis. He publishes widely in metaphor, discourse analysis, and language in interactional contexts like counseling and the classroom. His recent monographs include Metaphor in Psychotherapy. A Descriptive and Prescriptive Analysis (John Benjamins) and Time Series Analysis of Discourse. Method and Case Studies (Routledge). He is an academic editor with PLOS One, and review editor of Cognitive Linguistic Studies.



Dr. Kuang-yun Ting (丁廣韻) is Associate Professor of the Department of Applied English at St. John's University. She has a Doctoral Degree in Education from the University of Exeter (UK). Her PhD thesis researched "The Effect of Using Multiple Intelligences Approaches and Internet Resources in English Language Courses for University Students". She has taught English at several universities in Taiwan where she is currently teaching at St. John's University. Her research interests include Action Research, Multiple Intelligences Theory and various aspects of Computer Assisted Language Learning.

Dr. Ai-Ling Wang (王 萬 玲) is Associate Professor of the English Department at Tamkang University, New Taipei City, Taiwan. She got her M.A. in Bilingual Education from Texas A & I University, Texas, USA and Ph.D. in Bilingual Education from New York University, New York, USA. Her research interests include cross-cultural communications and exchanges, e-learning and m-learning, computer-mediated language learning, World Englishes and language varieties, and globalization and internationalization. She has many experiences of cross-cultural

An author of 11 books and over 80 peer-reviewed journal articles and international book chapters, Christine is a widely-cited scholar and many of her books and articles are important references in language teacher education and graduate programmes around the world. She has also advised the Ministry of Education of Singapore on English language education and research. As a faculty member in the English Language & Literature Academic Group, Christine has taught and managed various undergraduate, pre-service, in-service and higher degree courses and programmes, and she has been a research supervisor to many Masters and PhD students. She continues to supervise doctoral students. Christine received two NIE teaching commendation awards and was conferred the Public Administration Medal (Bronze) in 2014.

Research Overview

My research covers four overlapping areas: cognitive linguistics, metaphor theory, mental healthcare communication, and data analytics applied to discourse processes and products. One example of how these areas converge is language use in psychological counselling, an important type of mental healthcare communication. This language is often full of metaphors, which according to cognitive linguistics can provide insights into how people conceptualize their psychological issues. Furthermore, there is fascinating variability across speakers, cultures, time, and so on, which needs to be understood using both statistical modelling and qualitative analysis. I often engage with mental healthcare researchers and practitioners to work out the practical implications of linguistic research.

I am currently focusing on two research strands: i) the relationship between metaphor use and psychophysiological indicators of affect such as galvanic skin response, and ii) applying data analytic techniques (e.g. time series analysis, cluster analysis, sentiment analysis) to different discourse processes and phenomena (e.g. in counseling, newspapers, classrooms, and social media). I also have a secondary interest in language acquisition and pedagogical research, particularly the relevance and acquisition of quantitative literacy in humanities education. I am keen to collaborate on or supervise undergraduate/postgraduate research in any of the areas described above.
